

Title: Prolegomenon to an Informational Philosophy in Reality

Abstract:

In the acceptance of Wu Kun, the Philosophy of Information is a Metaphilosophy, incorporating informational-philosophical stances on major epistemological and ontological questions. Examples just from the contributions by Brenner to previous Philosophy of Information Conferences include personal identity; symmetry; semiotics; social competence and responsibility; and, together with Wu, the informational revolution in philosophy itself. The necessity of a non-standard logic of real processes in this approach was demonstrated. In this paper, Brenner and Igamberdiev analyze the dialectics as well as the logic underlying the application of Informational Philosophy. The utility of their approach is further demonstrated in the areas of meaning and semiotics, information itself and communication. A new characterization of the dynamic units of thought, hence of information processes, is suggested in advance of a planned, more detailed treatment.
